## WESTONKA AREA LEARNING ACADEMY (WALA)

The Westonka Area Learning Academy is a "school-within-a-school" alternative learning program at Mound Westonka High School. The WALA program includes required coursework in the four core disciplines: English, social studies, math and science, as well as an option for work experience credit. The WALA curriculum is innovative and includes inter-disciplinary and project-based learning units that provide rigor and relevance to learning.

Listed below are the at-risk indicators. A student under the age of 21 must meet one of the following criteria to be eligible to choose a non-traditional education program (ie: WALA):

- 1. Performs substantially below performance level.
- 2. Is behind in satisfactorily completing coursework.
- 3. Is pregnant or a parent.
- 4. Has been assessed as chemically dependent.
- 5. Has been excluded or expelled.
- Has been referred by a school district for enrollment in an eligible non traditional program.
- 7. Has been physically or sexually abused.
- 8. Has experienced mental health problems.
- 9. Has been homeless sometime in the last six months.
- 10. Speaks English as a second language or has limited English proficiency.
- 11. Has withdrawn from school or has been chronically truant.
- 12. Is being treated in a hospital in the seven-county metropolitan area for cancer or other life-threatening illness or is the sibling of the above scenario and resides at least 60 miles beyond the outside boundary of the seven-county metropolitan area.

To succeed in WALA, students must master the **ABC's**: Attendance, Behavior, and Coursework. Failure to master any of the ABC's will result in a **Debrief** with the WALA coordinator. Continued struggles with the ABC's would end with an **Exit** from the class(es). Here is what is expected in each of the areas:

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**Attendance** 

Attendance in class is critical to success. Students are expected to be on time and follow the WHS attendance policy. Tardiness and absenteeism from class(es) would initiate a debrief.

**Behavior** 

Students are expected to behave in such a way that maintains a positive learning experience for students and staff. Inappropriate cell phone use, sleeping in class, inappropriate language and conversations, etc. are all behaviors that would prompt a debrief.

Coursework

Students are expected to maintain a consistent "C" average in all WALA classes with few missing assignments. Failing grades will result in a debrief.

**Debriefs** 

Debriefs will take place when WALA staff members determine an intervention is needed. In class reminders and check ins with guided study staff are built-in ways to stay successful.

**Exits** 

Exits will occur when WALA staff deems it necessary to remove the student from class(es), and will result in a conversation with school counselors to determine a different learning environment.

Academic requirements are fulfilled periods 1-4 and mainstream elective opportunities are available periods 5-7. Interested students must contact the School Counseling department or the program coordinator to determine eligibility.
